- **Suspicious vehicles – we need your help!** Information from members of the public is crucial in helping us to prevent and detect crime, and details of vehicles seen in suspicious circumstances are especially useful to us. As much detail as possible is the ideal, so all or some of the following are gratefully received:

- **Registration number** – either the full number or part of it
- **Type of vehicle** – is it a car, van or motorbike?
- **Description** – make, model, colour and any livery or distinguishing marks
- **Condition of vehicle** – are there any scratches or dents?
- **Time and location** – when and where did you see the vehicle?
- **Description of driver and/or passengers**

- **Spate of criminal damage in Willingdon** Police are appealing for witnesses following a spate of criminal damage in Willingdon on the nights of 6-7 and 7-8 November. In Eastbourne Road, wing mirrors were smashed from two cars and a fence was damaged.

In Farmlands Way, three cars had their wing mirrors knocked off and two garden walls were damaged.

Houses in Gorrington Road and Gorrington Valley Drive also had garden walls partially demolished.

The previous week, between 2-3 November, two garden walls were damaged in Wannock Avenue, and a garden wall was knocked down in St John's Road in nearby Polegate overnight on 7-8 November.

Police Community Support Officer Alison Beaden said: "This sort of senseless vandalism causes great inconvenience and distress for local residents.

"In the case of the garden walls it would have taken some effort to do this sort of damage, so if anyone saw or heard anything suspicious in the areas during the times mentioned I would urge them to report it to police."

- **Witnesses sought to serious injury car crash near Hailsham** Witnesses are being sought to a car crash near Hailsham which led to a 20-year-old man sustaining serious head injuries.

It occurred at around 11.30pm on Wednesday (11 November) when a silver BMW car

travelling on the B2104 Ersham Road between Stone Cross and Hailsham left the road and struck a tree.

The driver, from near Chiddingly, was trapped in the vehicle until he could be freed by East Sussex Fire and Rescue Service personnel.

He was then taken by ambulance to the Royal Sussex County Hospital, Brighton, where he has been detained for treatment.

The road was closed to traffic for more than three hours while emergency services were at the scene, a half mile north of the World of Water.

- **Jackets theft, High Street, Uckfield** Two youths stole three Barbour jackets, each worth £148, from W E Cole Ltd's menswear shop in High Street, Uckfield, at around 4.15pm on Tuesday (10 November).
Both suspects are believed to be in their mid-teens and around 5'6" - 5' 7" tall. One was further described as being slim with cropped blonde hair and wearing a black jacket and denim jeans.
After snatching the jackets the pair ran off down Grange Road.

- **Theft from car, Framfield** At around 2pm on Sunday (8 November) a thief smashed the front nearside window of a silver Nissan Primera car parked next to stables in Etchingwood Lane, Framfield, before stealing a carrier bag in which was a wallet containing cash and bank cards. The bag had been left on the driver's seat.

- **Break-in at The Stores Department, Uckfield** Police are investigating a break-in at the Stores Department, Copwood Centre, Bell Brook industrial estate, Uckfield, which was reported to them on Sunday afternoon (8 November). A window had been smashed and cash stolen following an untidy search of offices.
